They travelled to the nearby land of Moab and settled there to live. The Moabite people did not worship God but their own idols.








Orpah and Ruth wept again. Orpah kissed Naomi goodbye and returned home to her mother's house. Ruth however clung hold of Naomi and would not let go.









When Naomi realized that Ruth was determined to stay with her they both set off on the road to Bethlehem





- Think of someone you know who is in need. What is keeping you from reaching out with compassion?




Ruth's great love for her mother-in-law is an example for all of us today. We should be more benevolent with others and share what we have.

The book of Ruth is only one of two books of the Bible named after women. The other one is Esther. This book is so different from the tone that has been set in Judges.

Loyalty versus unfaithfulness
Purity versus immorality
Harvest fields versus battlefields



The book of Ruth shows God's providence. Elimelech and Naomi's misfortune, two son's marriages to Moabitess girls, Ruth's loss of her husband and conversion to God. She is one of the four women mentioned by name in the genealogy of Jesus (Matt. 1)

But Ruth said, "Do not urge me to leave you or to return from following you. For where you go I will go, and where you lodge I will lodge. Your people shall be my people, and your God my God. Where you die I will die, and there will I be buried. May the Lord do so to me and more also if anything but death parts me from you."
