














Moses then wrote out the laws he had given the people and gave them to the priests to look after. He told them to read them to everyone every seven years when they gathered at the festival of tabernacles.






God then summoned Moses and Joshua to meet Him in the tabernacle. He appeared to them both in a great cloud at the tabernacle entrance.










After Moses died, Joshua and the people camped at Abel-Shittim on the east bank of the River Jordan.





















They reported to Joshua, 'The Lord really has given us the whole of this land. The people there are melting in fear because of us.'













God uses all types of people in his plans, even the most unlikely.


Throughout the Bible, God chooses people He wants instead of the "obvious" choice. The best example of this is Jesus and his unconventional background and humble life.



God keeps his promises no matter how long it takes.

God promised the people of Israel the land promised to them. It would have been easier for God to say "forget it!" after the people complained, disobeyed and generally made it difficult over and over again. But God made a promise and He is willing to wait to make things how He wants them in His own time.

This is the same for us. Sometimes we ask God for things and the answer is yes or no. But other times the answer is "not now" which might not make sense to us but of course God knows the plan for our lives so much more than we do. Even when we think we know better.



Memorials were important to God.

God instructs Joshua who tells the children of Israel exactly how to make a memorial to God with stones from the riverbed.

Today we have a memorial from God in the form of the Lord's Supper. This is also directed from God with specific instructions on how God wants this to be done.
