## Lesson 22: David Serves Saul 1 Samuel 18-20









The next day as David was playing the lyre, Saul had a spear in his hand. He hurled it saying, 'I'll pin him to the wall.' But David eluded him twice.


























Saul's anger flared at Jonathan. 'You have sided with David to your own shame. As long as he lives you will not become king. Send David to me so I can kill him.'








